You must be at the back of the hall (or at your exam room) at least 10mins before the start of your exam to ensure a prompt start and finishing on time. Line up alphabetically in your class for the subject of your exam. You must sit at the exam desk that has your exam ID on.

As Year 11s you should now be fully aware of the exam rules and procedures – You must follow the invigilators instructions.

Please bring all the equipment you need for your exams – black pens, pencils, rubber, ruler, math sets and calculators. This should all be brought in a clear case or bag.

Mobile phones must be OFF and in your bags. No smart watches, smart technology or notes can be in the exam hall, all other watches must be placed on your exam desk. Calculator lids must also be removed and placed in bags before the exam.

You may only bring water into your exam in a clear, plastic bottle with **no labels** – Invigilators will not be handing water out so please bring your own.

Take the opportunity to go to the toilet in break times and before exams start.
